

## It could only happen at Cliveden ... a Bubble for 'The Bubble'



Those familiar with Cliveden House and its remarkable grounds, will no doubt have to do a double-take, if they are fortunate enough to see the 'ultra-meta' Judd Apatow Netflix comedy 'The Bubble', which was released on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022. Cliveden and its close neighbour Hedsor House, both feature prominently as locations for the movie, which was filmed during lockdown in March 2021.

This film within a film, features Karen Gillan, Pedro Pascal, Leslie Mann, Keegan-Michael Key and David Duchovny, supposedly quarantined in a luxurious hotel waiting to complete a dinosaur-packed action thriller 'Cliff Beasts 6' ... but then things start to go badly wrong!

Actually, in reality, things could not have gone much better, since Cliveden was itself already in a bubble due to COVID protocols, which made it the ideal location for the film makers.

Commenting on the filming project, Cliveden's General Manager Francisco Macedo said: "It was great

to see first-hand the processes involved in film making, especially during such a challenging time due

to all the necessary restrictions. It was fascinating to see how everything came together with our team

on property, and the production team and cast working alongside each other. Luckily we had worked

with Location Manager Adam Richards previously, and his recommendation to use Cliveden was spot

on".

"As well as the 376 acres of National Trust gardens and woodland that was available to the production

team, filming also took place at locations throughout the building, on the roof space and of course on

the South Terrace, with several changes being made to accommodate the filming, but also to protect

the building, however most of these will not be noticed in the actual film itself, concluded Macedo.

Cliveden is of course no stranger to film makers. It stood in for Buckingham Palace in the iconic 1965

Beatles film 'Help!'. The estate's iconic Fountain of Love and Golden Clock Tower were recreated for

the 2014 remake of Cinderella starring Lily James, and many of the scenes from the Hollywood movie

'A Little Chaos' starring Kate Winslet and the now late Alan Rickman, were also film at Cliveden.

THE BUBBLE — synopsis. A major Hollywood studio is taking the bold move of shooting the sixth instalment of their mega blockbuster franchise during a global pandemic. Forced to operate inside a 'production bubble' the cast and crew of "Cliff Beasts 6" are locked down inside a country hotel, all willing to "do their part" in keeping the world entertained. After mandatory quarantine for 14 days the cast are excited for Day 1 of shooting which is filled with spectacular effects and stunts - Cliff Beasts is back! But after someone tests positive for covid, the production enforces a 21-day shut down where the isolation starts to take an emotional toll. Old resentments between cast members re-surface and one cast member snaps - running into the forest never to be seen again. Production security tightens as wristband tracking devices are enforced and hazmat suited guards are on every corner. A stunt gone wrong results in a further shut down and things get weirder for those already cracking under the pressures of isolation in what has become a prison. Being pushed to the edge, the lead actress makes a run for it but is caught by the Producer - she is detained and told; the Hollywood machine will always win. After a traumatic stint in custody, the actress is released and with the help of the other cast members they make a REAL escape. Amid gunfire and helicopter explosions the cast successfully break free.
